

From the underground to the mainstream, music is in constant flux (changing). The exhibition title ***Too Fast To Sing*** shows the dizzying, quick speed at which music's systems and values are evolving. This exhibition brings together a constellation of artists deeply engaged with transformations (changes), documenting, archiving, riffing on, and building upon music's contemporary metamorphosis. Together, they explore how music permeates our emotional lives and daily environments, how technological advances and aesthetics shape its sound, how we gather around it, and how visual artists use music and sound as raw material in their practices.

Look around - see if you can find the following!

A sculpture shaped like an extra long horn - what is the name of the artist who created it?

An artwork with your favorite color or colors. What is your favorite color?

Which artist(s) in this exhibit use your favorite color or colors?

An installation with a television, video player...who created this?

Two large hanging jackets. What would it feel like to wear the jackets? Who could you imagine wearing these?

Contemporary Art: Art that is made in current times; it usually refers to artwork by living artists.

Installation Art: A large-scale, mixed-media artwork, often designed for a specific place for a temporary period of time.

Primary Colors: Blue, red, and yellow are primary colors. When combined they create secondary colors: purple, green, and orange. Blue + red = purple. Blue + yellow = green. Yellow + red = orange

Sculpture: Three-dimensional art made by carving, modelling, casting or constructing.

Site-specific: An installation artwork that is designed and constructed especially for a certain space or location.

Sound: Vibrations that travel through the air that are audible (can be heard). Frequencies such as low and high pitched tones and music can also be felt through the body.
